HOW TO MAKE A SEDUM BOWL

- 1. Find a suitable receptacle. Almost anything will work but it must have a drainage hole.
- 2. Depending on the size of the drainage hole, place a piece of screen over the hole so that soil won't leak out, but drainage is maintained.
- 3. Fill your container with primarily cactus soil. If needed, go ahead and use an all-purpose potting soil to build volume. MIX the soils thoroughly no layering! Also no rocks or pebbles at the base. Remember to fill your container entirely with soil.
- 4. Water the soil to make sure there are no dips or gullies.
- 5. Create the grade that you want with the soil. Some people like a 'rounded' look, while others prefer a 'flatter' look.
- 6. Choose a pattern, maybe a mosaic?
- 7. Suggested items supplies to have on hand:
 - A bucket for excess soil.
 - Excess sedum bits and pieces to help fill in gaps.
- 8. Plant!
 - I like to call it the 'Pinch and Snuggle' method.
 - If you have a plant you want to be the focus of attention, start by planting it where you think it looks best in the bowl.
 - Next, plant around the edges of the bowl or planter. Plant in clumps or break your sedum hens and chicks into smaller pieces.
 - \circ Use plants you think are pretty or interesting. Use a mix for texture and color.
 - Don't worry about planting too close because sedum can tolerate being close together. You want them to have a lush, crowded look.
- 9. Fill in any gaps with soil mix, tamping lightly.
- 10. Water your sedum bowl in deeply to ensure contact with all the moving parts!
